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The 9th edition of the **Global Junior Challenge** [1] begins today in Rome. The international competition that rewards the creative use of technology for youth education will be held in Rome on **December 11-13, 2019**. The GJC database now houses nearly 4000 projects from around the world and 700 best cases selected by an international jury of experts.

The opening conference will present inclusive stories in contexts of high educational poverty to reflect on the role of school for the overall growth of communities, as per the message we inherited from Prof. **Tullio De Mauro** [2]. The showcase area will host over 60 projects that reveal a new way of learning. School administrators will enjoy a special session with the Lego® Serious Play® Methodology. Finally, the Awards Ceremony will be held on December 13 at the Rome Campidoglio [see progamme [3]].

The decision to host the ninth edition of the **Global Junior Challenge** at **Biblioteche di Roma** [4] is significant. Linguist Tullio De Mauro, a firm believer and supporter of libraries in his civic battles for culture as participation, was also the first President of the Rome Library System.
