The results of the School Innovation 2016 [1] call promoted by the Fondazione Cassa di Risparmio di Padova e Rovigo [2] have been published. The selection phase ended with 25 schools funded in the Provinces of Padua and Rovigo.

One is the Istituto Cattaneo-Mattei [3] in Monselice (Padoua) for Project “A 3.0 Innovation Gym: environments for constructionist learning for the future of school,” inspired by the first Innovation Gym [4] opened in Rome on Via del Quadraro [see: www.innovationgym.org [4]] and built in partnership with the Fondazione Mondo Digitale.
