In order to congratulate the school for their work and to encourage the students to continue their education, we introduced this year ceremonies awards in each school were the project took place. During the ceremony, the best students, according to their performances in school, of each class were recognized. In total 200 learners received gifts to motivate and encourage them to improve their results and achieve their education. The gifts were highly appreciated, the best of each class received school bags which represent a big expense for some girls but also the T-shirt of the program, many exercise books, pens, rulers or erasers .. The youngest ones received colors crayons to enjoy their free time and each school received Netball balls ( The Netball is a national sport played by girls in the Southern Africa similar to basketball). To crown it all participants, they performed some activities such as dramas and dances to conclude the day and it was a really nice moment. In addition, all the students from the school, parents and members from the communities were present to celebrate with us and encourage girls to continue this way.

This year, the Thinking Future - Keeping Girls in School Project has been implemented in 8 different schools and a total number of 1200 girls were attending the sessions, both Implemented by the trainers but also under the Thinking Future clubs in each school. In addition, in each school parents and communities were sensitized on the different subjects. It is a big achievement for the project and all ANPPCAN Malawi endeavors.

## OUR PLANS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2016/2017

In September 2016, the schools will open again to give the education that Malawian's pupils need to achieve their life goals. NPPCAN through its TFKGSP intend to implement new trainings in 10 new schools. We are targeting another 1 500 girls' students : a huge objective that we are not afraid to achieve !
